Title: The Betraying Tongue

"He who goes about as a gossip reveals secrets, But he who is trustworthy *and* faithful keeps a matter hidden." Proverbs 11:13 (AMP)

INTRODUCTION: A betrayer divulges information in breach of a confidence. They give information to the "enemy" and commit relational treason by violating the trust someone has placed on him. It is the treacherous exposing or deceiving of people by those they formerly trusted. It is usually associated with an enemy masquerading as a friend, or with a broken or abused relationship.

	"Brother will betray brother to death, and the father his child; and children will rise up <i>and</i> rebel against their parents and it will cause them to be put to death." Matthew 10:21 (AMP)
	"For the son dishonors the father <i>and</i> treats him contemptuously, The daughter rises up [in hostility] against her mother, The daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law— A man's enemies are the men (members) of his own household." Micah 7:6 (AMP)

	"Even my own close friend in whom I trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted up his heel against me [betraying me]." Psalms 41:9 (AMP)

"For it is not an enemy who taunts me-

Then I could bear it;

But it is you, a man my equal and my counsel, My companion and my familiar friend;

	"Those who trust in the Lord are steady as Mount Zion, unmoved by any circumstance." Psalms 125: 1 (Living Bible)
What	do you do when someone has betrayed your confidence?
1.	
	Have you released the offender in your heart and no longer desire revenge? Instead of holding onto unforgiveness, forgive the person and yourself.
	"Whenever you stand praying, if you have anything against anyone, forgive him [drop the issue, let it go] , so that your Father who is in heaven will also forgive you of your transgressions <i>and</i> wrongdoings [against Him and others]." Mark 11:25 (AMP)
2.	
	God saw the betrayal before it happened but chose not to intervene just as Judas betrayed Jesus, accept it as part of His sovereign plan.
	And we know [with great confidence] that God [who is deeply concerned about us] causes all things to work together [as a plan] for good for those who love God, to those who are called according to His plan <i>and</i> purpose. Romans 8:28 (AMP)
3.	
	Once you know better, you do better. Be more selective in who you tell your business to. Be cautious in who you let into your life. Remove yourself from people's lives who you don't trust.
	"Guard your heart above all else,
	for it determines the course of your life."

Proverbs 4:23 (NLT)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Paul warned Timothy in the following verse that in the last days, people will betray their friends. Perhaps you have experienced betrayal and disloyalty.
 - a. What was your reaction when you learned of the betrayal?
 - b. What are your feelings toward that person today?

If you are harboring unforgiveness, ask God to help you release it!

"But understand this, that in the last days dangerous times [of great stress and trouble] will come [difficult days that will be hard to bear]. ² For people will be lovers of self [narcissistic, self-focused], lovers of money [impelled by greed], boastful, arrogant, revilers, disobedient to parents, ungrateful, unholy and profane, ³ [and they will be] unloving [devoid of natural human affection, calloused and inhumane], irreconcilable, malicious gossips, devoid of self-control [intemperate, immoral], brutal, haters of good, 4 traitors, reckless, conceited, lovers of [sensual] pleasure rather than lovers of God, 5 holding to a form of [outward] godliness (religion), although they have denied its power [for their conduct nullifies their claim of faith]. Avoid such people and keep far away from them."

2. A betrayer is someone who divulges information in breach of confidence. It destroys trust. Have you ever betrayed someone else's trust with the hopes of negatively impacting someone? According to **Proverbs 25:9-10**, what happens when we do this?

3. Jesus was betrayed by those who were close to him, Peter and Judas (see scriptures below). Peter eventually went on to preach the gospel on the day of Pentecost and over three thousand people were saved. Judas died by suicide. When someone has betrayed you, how do you know who to restore in your life and who to release?

Peter...

"And a servant-girl, seeing him as he sat in the firelight and looking intently at him, said, "This man was with Him too." 57 But Peter denied it, saying, "Woman, I do not know Him!" 58 A little later someone else saw him and said, "You are one of them too." But Peter said, "Man, I am not!" 59 After about an hour had passed, another man began to insist, "This man was with Him, for he is a Galilean too." 60 But Peter said, "Man, I do not know what you are talking about." Immediately, while he was still speaking, a rooster crowed. 61 The Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter

remembered the word of the Lord, how He had told him, "Before a rooster crows today, you will deny Me three times."

Judas...

"Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "Whomever I kiss, He is the one; seize Him." ⁴⁹ Immediately Judas went to Jesus and said, "Greetings (rejoice), Rabbi!" **And he kissed Him [in a deliberate act of betrayal].** ⁵⁰ Jesus said to Judas, "Friend, do what you came for." Then they came and seized Jesus and arrested Him."
